Report an incident or hazard

The <u>Safety And Risk Analysis Hub (S.A.R.A.H.) (https://riskcloud.net/prod/?ccode=monash)</u>, is the University's online reporting tool and provides staff and students with a user-friendly way to report occupational health and safety (OHS) related hazards and incidents.

The S.A.R.A.H. reporting tool helps to ensure that all hazards, incidents and near misses involving Monash University staff, students, visitors and contractors are reported, investigated and recorded in accordance with Victorian OHS legislation and Monash University's Hazard and Incident reporting, investigation and recording procedure. How to report an OHS hazard or incident

Reports can be entered via:

- <u>S.A.R.A.H.</u> (https://riskcloud.net/prod/?ccode=monash)- A web browser which can also be accessed through the <u>my.monash portal (https://my.monash/campusm/home#menu)</u>.
- pocketSafety App (https://www.monash.edu/__data/assets/pdf_file/0011/2058959/PocketSafety-guide -SARAH.pdf) - A phone application compatible with Android and iPhone devices. This App allows you to capture photos, immediate information and statements about the hazard or incident at the time of occurrence.

- The work environment (e.g. air, water, land).
- Work related injuries, illnesses and near misses to staff, students, contractors and visitors.
- Allegations by staff being subjected to unacceptable behaviour.
- The mismanagement of waste material.
- Squandering of resources.

For Supervisors and Managers

Supervisors and Managers at Monash University have additional responsibility with respect to investigating and actioning hazards and incidents reported by staff under their direction.
